

THANK YOU HILLS CHURCH FOR CARING ABOUT THE PLIGHT OF THE SYRIAN REFUGEES ...

This year, your Christian Service Support Board felt led to offer financial help to Syrian refugees. We did this in two ways:

First, we directed our Christmas Offering to the relief of Syrian refugees through the UCC fund designated for that purpose. The funds will be used to help settle Syrian refugees in the United States and provide emergency aid to displaced people in the Middle East. Before Christmas, we asked you dear Hills Church Members to consider this unique time in the history of our nation and stand with those children of God who have suffered so much. You responded generously and enthusiastically, and we collected over \$16,000 for that purpose.

Second, we became aware of a local interfaith effort led by the Jewish Family Service of Metrowest to settle several Syrian refugee families in our community. We loved the idea of contributing to this cause in addition to the wider UCC fund, so \$500 from your tithes and offering (through the Christian Service Board budget) went towards the expressed need of customized ESL lessons for the parents of the Syrian family recently settled in our area. FAMILY PROMISE METROWEST IS OFFERING THREE TRAINING CLASSES IN FEBRUARY



Looking for an opportunity to serve those less fortunate? Family Promise Metrowest is a program that provides shelter, food, and fellowship, using space donated by area houses of worship, including the Hills Church. Volunteers help by setting up/tearing down sleeping space, making meals, or serving as dinner or overnight hosts. Helping to serve our Family Promise guests is a wonderful opportunity to work alongside friends or family to help folks in a homeless situation. No training is required, except for those wishing to serve as either a dinner or overnight host.

For those who do wish to serve as dinner or overnight host, FPM is offering one mid-day training class and two evening training classes in February – at the following locations:

- Tuesday, February 7, at Peace Lutheran Church, 107 Concord Road in Wayland,
- Sunday, February 12, at the Islamic Center, 126 Boston Post Road, in Wayland, and
- Thursday, February 23, at a location to be determined.

BACK TO THE FRONT OF THE NEW TESTAMENT:

SYNOPTIC GOSPELS AND ACTS, PARTS 1 AND 2

Adam Isbitsky, Seminarian Hills Church, and Rev. Pashington Obeng, Associate Minister

The Gospels hold a special place of importance for Christians within the biblical library because they tell the story of Jesus's life and his teachings. The first three Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke—contain a similar worldview and some of the same material, so they can be viewed together, or, synoptically. In this session, we will explore hypotheses as to the origins of these books and place them roughly on the first-century timeline. We will explore important features distinctive to each Gospel, such as style, authorship and audience. We will compare and contrast passages that appear in different Gospels. We will also consider Luke's second volume, known as the Acts of the Apostles/Holy Spirit, which recounts the stories of the early church. Please bring your own Bible to these sessions.

GLOBAL GATEWAY SERVICE RETREAT: FEBRUARY 10-12

Who: Junior High School Youth (Grades 7-8)

Where: Heifer Farm, Rutland, MA

What: Global Gateway participants experience the daily struggles people in poverty face every day. Participants are given little – just some simple ingredients – and before they can eat, they build a fire and cook their own meal. The challenge continues on into the night as they sleep in simple housing, such as a Peruvian clay house. Participants in the two-night program gain a deeper understanding of sustainable agriculture and life on the farm by participating in evening chores and enjoying a farm dinner on their first night. By living the lessons of poverty first-hand, participants come to understand the complications surrounding hunger and poverty and see their connection in creating change that brings possibility and hope to millions around the world.

CONFIRMATION RETREAT: MARCH 10-11

Who: Confirmation Class

Where: Prindle Pond

What: Join with the confirmation classes of churches in Massachusetts and New England. This year's theme: "Not That Kind of Christian: Re-articulating Faith for a New Generation." The mainstream view of Christianity among young people is not very favorable. Many youth and young adults see Christians as hypocritical, judgmental, anti-gay, and out of touch with reality. At our Retreat, we will address some of those stereotypes head on about what it means in our setting to be a follower of Jesus.

CITY REACH SERVICE RETREAT: MARCH 24-25

Who: High School Youth (Grades 9-12)

Where: Downtown Boston

What: CityReach gives young people and adults a chance to learn about homelessness from people who have experienced it, and may be still experiencing it. At CityReach we will also participate in our ministry with poor and homeless people by offering hospitality, food, and clothing to guests on Saturday morning inside the church and/or outside in downtown Boston as a street outreach team.
