#### AN INTEGRATED SERIES OF LENTEN SERMONS AND SPIRITUALITY GROUP DISCUSSIONS

### RECOMMENDED READING ON THE SABBATH

Copies of the following books are available at the church.

*The Sabbath*, by Abraham Joshua Heschel

As a rabbi and a professor, Heschel is an important voice of the 20<sup>th</sup> century. This book is a beautifully written account that combines scholarship of the scriptures and Jewish tradition with personal reflection.

*Keeping the Sabbath Wholly*, by Marva Dawn

Dawn offers a Christian theology that builds on the work of Abraham Heschel. This book organizes reflections around the themes of ceasing, resting, embracing, and feasting.

*Sabbath in the Suburbs*, by MaryAnn Mckibben Dana

Dana is a minister who writes about her family's journey to keep a Sabbath day over the course of a year. With active children and two working parents, she is honest about the successes, mistakes, and difficulties of spiritual practice. Published in 2012, this book is recognizable.

*Sabbath as Resistance*, by Walter Brueggemann

A great scholar of the Hebrew Scriptures, Brueggemann's book is rooted in the texts that describe the importance of Sabbath for the Hebrew people following the Exodus. He begins to draw connections to contemporary life as well.

## AN INVITATION TO LENTEN DEVOTIONALS AT HOME

A note from Katherine Blaisdell,  
Acting Associate Minister for Youth and Families

*I love Lent – the forty-days-plus-Sundays of preparation that precedes Easter. I love it more even than the preparation time for Christmas with its bells and lights. Perhaps that's because Lent is quieter than Advent, less busy -- nothing to compete with, unlike Advent alongside the gilded trappings of shopping mall Christmas. But I think it's because of my mom.*

*In my youth group years, my mother was at the height of her career growth. She was a successful pastor with a church that she grew from dwindling to thriving by the sweat of her ministerial brow. But that meant she worked hard. Sunday she taught adult ed classes and preached twice and then came home for rest and introvert time. Monday nights she met with church leaders to prepare for Tuesday night committee meetings. Wednesdays she stayed late at the office to get everything done before her sermon writing day on Thursday, but work usually spilled over into the weekend anyway. So it wasn't always easy for us to find time together.*

*But Lent was different. All the years of my awkward adolescence, for six weeks in the spring, my mother would leave work early to pick me up, take me to dinner, and then take me to Wednesday night's Lenten Bible Study.*

*It wasn't fun, per se. It wasn't Disneyworld trips. It wasn't the movies and ice cream. It was Bible study with a bunch of adults talking about temptation and suffering and mortality. But I loved it. It was lighting candles and quiet singing and trying to find God. It was a few hours with my mom every week, reflecting together on what it meant to be human. And I still treasure it.*

*So this is an invitation to find your treasure. For the next six Mondays, you'll receive an email with an opportunity for Bible study and spiritual practice. Gather your family, your walking group, or your spouse for a moment of quiet – not because you have the time, but because you don't. See what Lent has to offer you and yours together. Each week, we'll offer you an application of scripture to a favorite picture book. Each study will have enough of a synopsis that you don't have to buy the book, but if you want to read the books together, here's the list of books for each week:*
