**WELLESLEY HILLS CONGREGATIONAL CHURCH
CALL TO ANNUAL MEETING – SUNDAY, JANUARY 27, 2019**

The members of the First Congregational Church in Wellesley Hills, Massachusetts, qualified to vote, are hereby notified that the Annual Meeting of said church will be held on Sunday, January 27, 2019 at approximately 11:00 AM, immediately following the Sunday worship service, to act upon the following articles:

Article I. To choose, if necessary, a chairperson to preside over said meeting.

Article II. To hear and act upon the reports of the clerk, treasurer, auditors, Church Council, Support Boards, and of such other officers and governing bodies as may be present.

Article III. To elect a rising moderator, clerk, assistant clerk, treasurer, assistant treasurer, auditor, and such other officers and members of governing bodies as the Church may require for the ensuing year.

Article IV. To hear and discuss reports by representatives of the Master Plan Steering Committee and the Office of the Moderator on 1) recent problems with the Church's heating system, 2) the status of the Master Planning process which began last year, and 3) two related line-items included in the 2019 Budget allocating a total of \$55,000 for purposes of assessing the Church's heating system needs and evaluating funding options, including the possibility of a capital campaign.

Article V. To review and act upon the Budget for the Church for the coming year, as presented by the Stewards Support Board and supported by Church Council, to meet the expenses, the benevolences and any indebtedness of the Church, with funds to be raised as indicated.

Article VI. To transact any other business not included in the above which may legally come before the meeting.

TRANSITIONING TO ANNUAL MEETING

General Instructions

- 1) **Copies of this year's Annual Report, including additional information about the church's recent heating system problems**, are available in the North and South Narthices, in the foyer just outside the Reception Room, and on the rectory table in the North Mezzanine of the Assembly Room. Please share with those sitting beside you.
- 2) The materials which will be reviewed at the Annual Meeting itself are in white envelopes at the end of each of the pews in the four front sections of the Sanctuary – under the Fellowship Pads. At the end of the Worship Service, please take an envelope if you will be staying for the Annual Meeting.
- 3) The service will be shortened to accommodate those who have after-church commitments. We strongly encourage you to stay for the Annual Meeting.
- 4) Childcare will be provided on the 3rd floor during the meeting.
- 5) We will not have a “regular” Community Hour, but coffee and tea will be available in the Board Room. You will have about five minutes to get your coffee. Please enter the Boardroom through the rear of the Sanctuary and exit through the door to the Narthex. Please bring your coffee or tea with you into the Sanctuary – and to avoid spills in the Sanctuary, please be sure to use one of the coffee cup lids provided.
- 6) When the Moderator calls for you to return to your seat, please do so promptly. We will need to perform a count for a quorum, and we need people in their seats to do so. We will also want people to move forward in the Sanctuary, if possible.
- 7) The meeting will begin when the quorum has been counted and confirmed.

Annual Meeting Procedural Guidelines

- 1) Only members are allowed to vote. Friends of the church are welcome to listen in and participate by speaking. You may sit anywhere.
- 2) The meeting agenda is the Call to the Annual Meeting – reprinted above.
- 3) Each agenda item will be brought to the floor by the Moderator, who will ask for the appropriate person—generally, the committee chair—to make a motion. That motion will be seconded, and then we will have discussion. Generally, the person who made the motion, or a designee, will speak first.
- 4) If you wish to speak to a particular agenda item, you may contact the Moderator in advance, and she will make sure that you are given time to speak.
- 5) Raise your hand to indicate you wish to speak. Before speaking, wait for an usher to deliver a microphone to you. Tell us your name—even if everybody knows you. Speakers should be direct, and to-the-point.
- 6) When all who wish to be heard have been heard, or a motion to “move the question” has been made and passed, we will have a voice vote.

After some light refreshments in the Assembly Room, we will head to various sites around the church to work on projects. Projects are designed for young people, old people, and everyone in-between. Most will take about an hour or so. Service Opportunities are varied and for all abilities.

Choose your favorite community service project from among the following opportunities: Making Meals and Baking Cookies for the Wellesley Food Pantry, the Wellesley Fire Department, the Wellesley Police Department, and our own Care Team Ministry; Assembling Tables and other furniture – and sorting donations – for the New Life Furniture Bank; Writing letters of support, gratitude, friendship, and love to our older members, local heroes, other area churches and institutions with missions consistent with our own, and; Making fleece scarves for underprivileged children.

Individuals and families coming out of homelessness have little or nothing to get started in a new apartment. New Life Furniture Bank can provide them with gently used furniture and housewares like sheets, pots and pans, dishes, silverware, glasses. But that first trip to the store to buy basic essentials can be very expensive. Clients really appreciate a plastic laundry basket filled with practical everyday living stuff. **On Sunday, February 3**, the church hopes to put together at least ten “Housewarming Baskets” filled with the items below. We will be assembling these baskets right after the Worship Service – so, please either bring your donations on Sunday or leave them on the Assembly Room stage during the week.

- Sponges/scrubbers
- Laundry detergent
- Shower curtain liner
- Paper Towels
- Scissors
- Cleaning items (409 or Comet)
- Like new or new bedding
- Tall kitchen trash bags
- Kleenex Box
- Toilet brush Can opener
- Small plastic cutting board
- Dish detergent Bar of soap
- Small Flashlight
- Like new or new towel sets

Join other volunteers for hands-on service projects that will touch the lives of local people in need. This is a great family service opportunity at church!

And please: Don't come empty handed! Bring a can of food, gently used bedding, towels or toiletries for someone in need. Child Care will be provided from 9:30 - 2:00 p.m. in the upstairs nursery for those too young to serve.

THANKS FROM THE ALTERNATIVE GIFT FAIR!

The Christian Service Board would like to thank the congregation for its generous support of the church's Alternative Gift Fair in December. Your contributions raised nearly \$3,300 to support the church's partnerships with the African Indian Alliance and Honduras Hope.

- **African Indian Alliance:** Your purchase of our educational note cards will help fund direct scholarships to ~30 economically disadvantaged Siddi students in SW India and will provide tutoring and nutrition assistance to even more. Approximately two thirds of the students receiving scholarships are in primary or secondary school. The remaining third are pursuing post-secondary studies either in technical training (usually tailoring) or college. In the past, AIA has sponsored nurses, teachers, lawyers, social workers, and Christian religious leaders with the understanding that the recipients will return to the Siddi community to help others advance economically and socially once they have finished their formal studies. We are excited to put your gifts to use and thank you for your generosity!
- **Honduras Hope:** Your purchase of the handcrafted baskets and additional donations will help Honduras Hope continue its important work with economically and politically marginalized families in Honduras. The baskets were made by members of the Women's Cooperative in Plan Grande, a Tolupani Indian Reservation. Honduras Hope purchases the baskets from the women for a fair trade value and sells them in the US. In addition to generating income for their families, this micro-business teaches small business skills, brings lasting economic change to the entire community, and empowers the women who participate. This is important work, for as a 2006 UNICEF report notes, "When women are empowered to lead full and productive lives, children and families prosper." 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WHAT'S UP WITH THE WHCC HEATING SYSTEM? – FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

As many of you are aware, the performance of the church's heating system has been less than 100% of late. Here is a brief summary of the situation. (For more information about this important topic, please be sure to attend this year's Annual Meeting on Sunday, January 27, right after the Worship Service.

Q1. What's the problem?

A1. The heating system and all of its component parts, i.e., boiler, valves, steam pipes, radiators, need to be replaced because they have failed several times already this winter.

Q2. Why now?

A2. The system is reaching the end of its useful life. Recent component failures alerted us to the need to attend to it over the summer of 2019 prior to the next heating season. It is imperative that we maintain our church buildings in a manner that sustains and facilitates the important work of our church community.

Q3. What will it cost?

A3. We don't know. The cost will depend on several factors, including what equipment we choose to repair/replace/install.

Q4. Who will decide what to do?

A4. The congregation will decide. There is a team of professionals working with church leaders to identify alternative solutions. After review of the need and preparation of a report, this team, including church leaders, will bring a recommendation to the congregation for approval of the work and the related cost.

Q5. How will we pay for it?

A5. There is a team of church leaders who will identify funding alternatives, including a possible capital campaign or borrowing.

Q6. How will the construction work affect church and nursery school operations?

A6. Church leaders, church staff, the consultants, and the contractor will work closely with church and nursery school staff to minimize disruption to church and nursery school operations. The plan for summer time construction is aimed specifically at minimizing disruption.
