THEN JOIN THE CARE TEAM MINISTRY OF THE HILLS CHURCH!**




Would you like to reach out to members of the congregation who are experiencing life's joys, sorrows or other challenges?

Just as the Spirit led Jesus into the wilderness for a period of reflection and prayer, we invite you to be led on a Lenten journey through the pages of these written works:




**INSPIRED**, by Rachel Held Evans, a New York Times best-selling author, who has been featured in *The Washington Post*, *The Guardian*, *Christianity Today*, *Slate*, *The Huffington Post*, *The CNN Belief Blog*, and on NPR. Evans served on President Obama's Advisory Council on Faith Based and Neighborhood Partnerships.

Evans asks the question, "What do people mean when they say the Bible is inspired?"

One reviewer wrote: "Evans wrestles through the process of doubting, imagining, and debating Scripture's mysteries. The Bible...is not a static work but is a living, breathing, captivating, and confounding book that is able to equip us to join God's loving and redemptive work in the world."

In her book, Tippett reflects on what she calls the "breeding ground of wisdom: words, flesh, love, faith and hope." We'll wrestle with big questions: what does it mean to be human? What matters in life? How can we be of service to one another?"


Now is the time to make more shawls, and the cabinet in the Church Library has been replenished with patterns, needles, and Homespun yarn.
