For those who are not available to meet this Sunday, or to finalize a pledge, volunteers will follow up to arrange a visit or a phone call.

We are very close to wrapping up this campaign, and I am grateful to everyone who has offered their prayers, given their time, and made their gift commitments. May God continue to bless our church’s mission and ministries with many gifts, united by one Spirit.
